Councillor Thornicroft reported on an annual tree inspection, that the lower woodland path project had been completed with a County Council grant, and that there had been a hiking group featured on Women's Hour on BBC Radio 4.

He said that repairs to the plot house had depleted the reserves and Trustees were looking for more fundraising initiatives. A sub-committee had been formed to report back at the next meeting.

Application for Grant Aid



Name of organisation:

Aston Lodge Residents Association

Purpose of organisation:

A community organisation for the residents of Aston Lodge estate in Stone. ALRA's aim is to develop community cohesion and to improve Aston Lodge as a place to live. This is achieved through volunteering, community work groups, social events and community action on issues that affect the residents.

Amount of grant requested:

£500

Total cost of project (if appropriate):

£825

Reason for grant request:

Aston Lodge estate has several miles of footpath, unadopted by the authorities and mostly bordered by dense grass, brambles and nettles. There are also 10 sections of hedgerow that were planted by the developers over 25 years ago, also unadopted nor maintained by the authorities. Over the last 5 years, ALRA volunteers have worked hard to restore overgrown footpaths as well as successfully restoring and maintaining the overgrown hedgerows. This work continues year on year to keep the pathways open and safe.

For the last 3 years the volunteers have been using two battery powered Bosch strimmers, purchased with the help of an STC grant. These are now reaching the end of their useful life as the motors are wearing out and the battery life is reduced. They are not cutting through the vegetation. Alongside this, the volunteers don't mind admitting they are getting older and suffering from the usual aches and ailments. They will continue to meet 3 times a week but they need the heavy strimming and clearing up to be done more easily and efficiently, especially in the peak growing season.

The solution is to invest in a heavy-duty cordless strimmer that has the power to deal with the undergrowth as well as the battery life to go for an hour or more when needed. They also need a powerful but light-weight leaf blower to aid with the huge amount of clearing up. ALRA has tested out the Stihl FSA 60R Cordless Strimmer and the Stihl BGA 60R Cordless Blower and found these to be far more effective than the ailing domestic grade Bosch tools.

ALRA also needs to buy appropriate PPE for the person using the strimmer. Only 3 able volunteers will be permitted and trained to use the strimmer.

The grant request is for £500 towards the total cost of £825 for strimmer, blades, leaf blower and PPE. ALRA will fund the £325 from its reserves which, in July, after upcoming expenses, will stand at approximately £650. ALRA's income is derived from social events organised by ALRA and attended by residents. Grant support is needed as we would struggle to raise these larger sums of money. Additionally ALRA is saving the authorities a considerable amount of resource by maintaining the pathways. The new tools will be purchased from by local businesses whenever possible.

ALRA has considered asking SCC to adopt the pathways but it's not an option we want to pursue at the moment because the volunteer sessions are an important activity which helps to generate community spirit.

NB: The volunteers endeavour to protect the natural environment. They only remove growth that impedes the pavements. They have created a network of dead hedge habitats to support insects, birds and small mammals. Other green waste is bagged by the volunteers and removed by Streetscene. Blue Frog Gardening Service have donated their time and equipment for heavy hedge cutting and authorised disposal.

ALRA has a current constitution and holds an annual AGM.

Benefits to Stone residents:

It is essential to keep the pathways clear so that residents can use them, safe from brambles, nettles and overgrown hedges. Clear and tidy pathways encourage walkers, joggers and families to get outside. Unkept pathways deter people from walking.

The longest unadopted pathway on the estate is the main pedestrian route to Lichfield Road. It is used by many, including schoolchildren, to walk to town. The volunteers have worked tirelessly to keep this path tidy and safe.

The volunteer activity benefits the whole estate by generating a community spirit. The volunteer group benefits from the exercise and friendship.

Environmental Impact of proposals:

The overall impact to the environment is positive because of the controlled cutting of path verges as well as the building of dead hedges and insect habitat. The volunteers have also successfully restored the sections of hedgerow maintaining them as good habitat for birds etc. All hedge cutting is done to comply with nesting periods.

No other sources of funding have been contacted.

Is this an “exceptional” request (see notes)? If so, please explain why the Council should treat it as an exception:

This is an exceptional request that ALRA would appreciate being reviewed at the June General Purposes meeting because the new strimmer and leaf blower are urgently needed for the current season. The existing Bosch strimmers are on their last legs and the grass is growing quickly!

Grants awarded by the Council in the last two years, and the uses made of the funding:

None in the last two years. Previous grants have been fully utilised to buy equipment for the volunteers and to carry out a successful speed awareness campaign on the estate.
